A. CHAIR'S WELCOME

RECEIVED: This item was verbally presented by LSA.

B. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING OF THE ENTERTAINMENTS BOARD

C. MATTERS ARISING

NOTED:

- 1. KK has investigated into jazz venues. One venue is small (with a maximum of around 20-30) but would be £5 entry. Whilst it was felt this could be easy to repeat, LSA suggested it would be an appropriate candidate for a committee bonding session. Any such event will need to take place after Christmas. This would allow time to look for an alternative venue.
- 2. SY reported that an inter-CU league is pending a meeting with the other CUs. This would likely consist of casual sports. There have been requests for more bar nights with gamers, this is feasible with advance planning. The previous bar night was very popular, potentially due to its novelty. RCSU feedback is the number of tills open at the bar was unacceptable, and a lack of cloakroom is poor.

6. Regarding plubicity, the disco balls were not liked but instead the Northern Lights could be a successful theme for the publicity. Any publicity will require approval by the Ents Board via Facebook. Additionally The CGCU and the venue will need to inspect the publicity.
